

## STRONG IS THE NEW LOOK FOR NOSES

There are many reasons to seek nose reshaping—or “rhinoplasty”—including removing a bump or changing the size of the nose. “Rhinoplasty is one of the original plastic surgery procedures,” says Dr. H. Sasson, a plastic surgeon in Great Neck. “And while the actual technique has not changed much over the years, the desired shape is different today.” Twenty years ago, the look was “more chiseled, curved in,” says Dr. Sasson. Today, the trend is to create strong, well-defined noses. Dr. Sasson performs the “closed approach,” which causes less swelling and scarring, and a faster recovery. “The cuts are all done through the nostrils,” notes Dr. Sasson. “It defeats the purpose of having the surgery if it scars.”
